## 1. From Abraham to Egypt: redeemed to worship the Lord

- Exodus 1:7 keeping covenant promises: a great people
- Exodus 2:23-24 God is bound by covenant
- Exodus 3:11-12 redeemed to worship
- Exodus 19:4-6 Rescue = "brought you to myself"
  - **Obligation** = "keep my covenant"
  - **Privilege** = "kingdom of priests"
- Exodus 19:21-23 = the problem of a holy God


Ps 24:3-4, "Who shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false and does not swear deceitfully."

The house that God built


"the Tabernacle" = Exodus 25-31, 35-40 "the tent of meeting" (Leviticus 1:1)




### God's house with 3 rooms: made to look like His Holy Mountain

### • God's house was a copy of his Heavenly home

- It had to be "just so"!! (see Exodus 25:9)
- Because of what it was made to copy

Hebrews 8:5, "copy and a shadow of the heavenly things." Hebrews 8:1-2, "the throne of the Majesty in heaven... the true tent that the Lord set up."
