3. JESUS' DEATH UPON THE CROSS 1 PETER 2:22-25 & ISAIAH 52:13-53:12

INTRODUCTION: SIGNIFICANCE AND BACKGROUND TO THE ATONEMENT

<u>1. As Jesus dies upon the Cross at whom is God angry?</u> (Mark 15:33-34) Answer: On the cross Jesus was punished by God in our place

- Elsewhere: Exodus 12 (Passover); Leviticus 1-7 & 16 (sacrificial system and day of atonement); Isaiah 52:13-53:12; Mark 10:33-45, 15:33-34; John 3:14-18, 11:47-52; Romans 3:21-26, 4:25, 5:8-10, 8:1-3, Galatians 3:10-13; 1 Peter 2:21-25, 3:18

2. HOW CAN A JUST GOD GOD FAIRLY ACQUIT GUILTY PEOPLE? ANSWER: ON THE CROSS JESUS BORE THE SINS OF EVERYONE IN UNION WITH HIM

(a) God deals with us in covenant relationships (e.g. 2 Sam. 21, 2 Cor. 5:14)

(b) Christians are joined to Christ

- Romans 6:5, "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his" (ESV).
- This union with Christ permits a double exchange of both righteousness and wickedness
- 2 Corinthians 5:21, "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

3. How can the Father fairly punish his innocent Son? Answer: On the cross Father, Son & Spirit together accomplish salvation

(a) An accusation

(b) Two insufficient answers

- "Jesus was a willing victim"
- "It's fair because God does it"

(c) A proper understanding of the holy Trinity

- John 5:19, "Jesus gave them this answer: "I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does."
- Who gave Christ to be Crucified? F = Romans 3:25; S = Galatians 1:3-4

4. Was the Trinity broken as Jesus died? Answer: On the Cross God the Son was forsaken as a man

- (a) The Trinity cannot be broken (John 10:30)
- (b) God the Son is without end and cannot die (1 Tim. 1:17)
- (b) We needed a human substitute for human sin (1 Pet. 2:24, Heb. 10:5)
- (d) The eternal Son suffered in his human nature

5. DID JESUS DIE FOR EVERY PERSON WITHOUT EXCEPTION? ANSWER: ON THE CROSS JESUS DIED FOR THOSE WHOM GOD HAS CHOSEN

(a) Hypothetical universalism or limited atonement?

(b) Biblical evidence for definite atonement

- (i) Texts stating that "Jesus died for some" (and not for all)
 - His sheep (and not those outside his flock), John 10:14-15, 26
 - The church, Acts 20:28
 - The elect, Romans 8:32-34
- (ii) Texts showing that Jesus' death actually works salvation
 - 1 Peter 3:18, Romans 5:9
- (iii) Texts showing that if Jesus died for you then you will receive all blessings
 - Romans 6:5, Romans 8:32-34

(c) Five big problems if Jesus did die for every single individual

- (i) Jesus' death saves no-one
- (ii) God is unjust, punishing the same sins twice
- (iii) Penal substitution is not true
- (iv) The will and plan of God fails
- (v) The will of God is divided
- (d) What about Bible texts speaking of "all", "every", the "world"?
- (e) In our evangelism can't we say that "Christ died for you?"
- (f) If God loves everyone surely Jesus must have died for everyone?
