# THE PROPHESIED KINGDOM — ISRAEL'S HISTORY PART TWO EZEKIEL 36:16-32

#### **RECAP**

## 1. THE END OF THE OLD TESTAMENT (1 KINGS 12 – 2 KING 25)

• Solomon's golden age → disobedience, division and decline

1 Kings 12:28, "After seeking advice, the king made two golden calves. He said to the people, "It is too much for you to go up to Jerusalem. Here are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of Egypt."

God's judgment: Assyria destroys Israel (722BC)

2 Kings 17:7, "All this took place because the Israelites had sinned against the LORD their God, who had brought them up out of Egypt from under the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt. They worshiped other gods."

God's judgment: the destruction of Judah (597/586BC)

Psalm 137:1, "By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion."

The return from Exile (538BC)

Ezra 3:11-12, "With praise and thanksgiving they sang to the LORD: "He is good; his love to Israel endures forever." And all the people gave a great shout of praise to the LORD, because the foundation of the house of the LORD was laid. <sup>12</sup> But many of the older priests and Levites and family heads, who had seen the former temple, wept aloud when they saw the foundation of this temple being laid, while many others shouted for joy."

The point of the OT? We need GOD... to do something FOR US... and IN US

Jeremiah 1:4, "The word of the LORD came to me, saying..."
