- Apocalyptic (pulling back the curtain)
- Written to encourage Christians who are waiting for the return of Christ (1v3, v7). Perseverance is the goal see 2v7, v11, v17, v26, 3v5, v12, v21!

Evil itself, and Satan, the origin of evil will be destroyed

20v10 - note: Satan will not 'rule' hell, he will be tormented day and night for ever

Those who refuse to acknowledge Christ's rule will be destroyed

20v15, 21v8

Judgment is terrible, but it is also good news

GOD'S PEOPLE

Uncountable - 7v9 (see Genesis 15v1-5!)

What about the 144,000?

From every tribe, tongue and nation - 7v9

Gathered together, Babel reversed (Genesis 11)

He who overcomes - 21v7
