

HEALTHY CHURCH 9: CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

1. CHURCH MEMBERSHIP IS UNAVOIDABLE

1 Corinthians 12:26-27 (see Acts 9:4)

→ A union which is deep (12:26) and significant (12:13)

Applications

2. CHURCH MEMBERSHIP IS IDENTIFIABLE

Q: "Is Church Membership a Biblical idea?"

"In one sense, no. Open up the New Testament, and you won't find a story about, say, Priscilla and Aquila moving to the city of Rome, checking out one church, then another, and finally deciding to join a third. From what we can tell, nobody went 'church shopping' because there was only one church in each community. In that sense, you won't find a list of church members in the New Testament." (Mark Dever, What is healthy church, p93).

Biblical evidence:

(a) Illustrations that are used to describe local churches – they are definable

A body (1 Cor.12)

A flock of sheep, a building, a household (Acts 20:28, Ephesians 2:21, 1 Timothy 3:15).

(b) The meaning of "the whole church"

1 Corinthians 14:23, "If, therefore, the whole church comes together..."

(c) Instructions for pastoral care

Pastors to care for "all the flock" (e.g. Acts 20:28, Philippians 1:1, Hebrews 13:17).

(d) The meaning of the word "join"

No-one dared "join" the church (Acts 5:13) = very deep commitment = a word used both of sex and union with Christ (1 Corinthians 6:16, 17)

(e) Instructions for church discipline

1 Corinthians 5:1-2, 12-13: include... in order to exclude

Matthew 18:15-18, "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. ¹⁶ But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. ¹⁷ If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. ¹⁸ Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

3. COMMON QUESTIONS AND PROBLEMS...

Q: Is it possible to stick with Jesus – but have a non-formal or even casual relationship to a local church?

Q: What if you've been hurt by a church before?

4. APPLICATION: WITH GOD'S HELP BE A FAITHFUL CHURCH MEMBER.

(a) Church membership at Immanuel
= You say: "I'm converted, pursuing holiness, and committed to Immanuel" = The church says: "We agree!"
(See church membership covenant)
(b) With God's help, be an increasingly faithful church member
Distinguish: comfort-based commitment and calling-based commitment.
Think: Why do you come, and keep coming to church? Social or personal reasons
vs Obey God and delight in His church
Starts with commitment up front (a bit like a marriage!): deciding to sacrifice, to gather, to encourage and to guard one another
deciding to sacrifice, to gather, to encodinge and to guard one another
Requires investment in relationships
inequires investment in relationships
