This really happened! The ancient historian Josephus wrote about a terrible famine in Jerusalem in AD 45-46 when many died.

## 4 There will be terrible times for Christians

Did you  
know?

This really happened. The book of Acts tells us about Christians being put in prison and even killed for following Jesus. The disciples were warned: **keep following Jesus!**

## 5 The good news will be preached

Look at verse 14.

**Did you know?**

This really happened! In Paul's letter to the Colossians (chapter 1 verse 6) he says in the **whole world** the good news is bearing fruit.

Remember - Jesus was answering his d\_\_\_\_\_s

question: When would the T\_\_\_\_\_ be destroyed?

Jesus told them it would happen when all these things had taken place.

**Did you know?** He was right (of course)! The Romans burned the temple down in AD 70. But this was really the judgement of the **powerful** and **glorious Jesus**.
